Manufacturers' Membership Incentive Program

As a follow up to our announcement at the Annual Meeting, the Board of Governors is excited to announce the revised Entrance Fees and a new Member Incentive Program, effective immediately.

After giving much thought during these tough economic times and hearing what our competition has done in our market we are adopting a very proactive approach to recruit new members for the upcoming year. The market dynamics suggest:

- 1) Distressed clubs have lowered initiation fees.
- 2) Established clubs are addressing long term economic changes.
- 3) Increased Golf Membership is essential for all clubs.

As a result, our Golf Membership Entrance fee is now \$7,500.

In addition, each member will be mailed details of the new Member Incentive Program. Here are some highlights of the new program. Each member will be issued a certificate that may be used in a variety of ways to help recruit new Golf members:

- You can give the certificate to a prospective Golf member to use as a \$4,000 credit against the \$7,500 entrance fee.
- You can give the certificate to a Golf member in good standing of another country club, to transfer to MGCC as a Golf member without any entrance fee.
- You can give the certificate to a prospective Junior Golf member (ages 21-34) to use as a credit and to be admitted without any entrance fee.
- You can give the certificate to any Legacy prospect who didn't take advantage of membership to be admitted without any entrance fee.
- You can give the certificate to a former Golf member of MGCC to be readmitted without any entrance fee.
- Any House member can use the certificate and the initial entrance fee paid as a \$5,500 credit against the \$7,500 entrance fee to upgrade to a Golf membership.

All potential new members will go through the normal membership process including obtaining sponsors, interviews, and approval from the Board. Any previous member who wants to return to the club must have left the club in good standing. This program supersedes any prior incentive programs.

Description Of Categories Of Membership For Current Club Members

FAMILY GOLF A memberships are available to members age 35 and older desiring golf and all other Club privileges for the member and the member's spouse. This membership class entitles the member to the golfing privileges of a Primary Golf member and the member's spouse to the golfing privileges of a golf member.

SENIOR GOLF A memberships are available to members age 35 and older desiring golf and all other Club privileges. This membership class entitles the member to the golfing privileges of a Primary Golf member. If married, the member's spouse shall have all Club privileges except golf, which is available five times per year upon payment of the greens fee.

NON-VOTING GOLF A memberships are available to spouses of deceased voting members desiring to retain golf and all other Club privileges without the right to vote. This membership class entitles the member to the golfing privileges of a golf member.

FAMILY GOLF B memberships are available to members age 70 and older who have been members in good standing for 20 years or more. Privileges are the same as FAMILY GOLF A.

SENIOR GOLF B memberships are available to golf members age 70 and older who have been members in good standing for 20 years or more. Privileges are the same as SENIOR GOLF A.

NON-VOTING GOLF B memberships are available to spouses of deceased voting members 70 and older who have been members in good standing for 20 years or more. Privileges are the same as NON-VOTING GOLF A.

JUNIOR GOLF 21-30 memberships are available to those desiring golf and all other Club privileges for the member and the member's spouse. This membership class entitles the member to the golfing privileges of a Primary Golf member and the member's spouse to the golfing privileges of a golf member. This membership class has no voting privileges.

JUNIOR GOLF 31-34 memberships are available to those desiring golf and all other Club privileges for the member and the member's spouse. This membership class entitles the member to the golfing privileges of a Primary Golf member and the member's spouse to the golfing privileges of a golf member. This membership class has no voting privileges.

HOUSE memberships are available to individuals, single or married, age 21 and older, who desire all Club privileges, except golf which is available to them and their spouses a total of six times a year between them upon payment of the greens fee. (See the current Golfing Calendar for additional information regarding the golfing privileges of House members.) House members may play an unlimited number of rounds after the season ends (November 1st through March 31st) upon payment of the off-season greens fee. Children's golf privileges are available in accordance with the current Junior Golf Handbook and the current Golfing Calendar upon payment of the appropriate golf privilege fee. No children of House members are permitted to play golf at any time, except those participating in the Junior Golf Program. Children age 18 and older of House members have no golf privileges.

Description Of Categories Of Membership For Current Club Members

HOUSE B memberships are available to members age 70 and older who have been members in good standing for 20 years or more. Privileges are the same as HOUSE.

SOCIAL memberships are available to individuals, single or married, age 21 and older, desiring Clubhouse privileges only. Social members and their spouses may play a total of three rounds of golf between them at times available to a golf member, other than weekends and holidays, (when no play is permitted), only as a guest in the company of a member with golf privileges, upon payment of the greens fee. Social members have no pool or tennis privileges.

SOCIAL B memberships are available to members age 70 and older who have been members in good standing for 20 years or more. Privileges are the same as SOCIAL.

SOCIAL C memberships are available to members age 80 and older who have been members in good standing for 35 years or more. Social C members are exempt from paying all dues and assessments and the privileges are the same as SOCIAL.

NON-RESIDENT GOLF memberships are available to individuals whose principal residence is located more than 100 miles from the Club. Principal residence is defined as the member's place of actual residence for more than six months of the year, including at least three months from April to September; it being intended that one who is able to use the facilities for the bulk of the summer season should hold a resident membership. Members in this classification and their spouses shall have golf privileges to play a total of 12 times per year between them upon payment of the greens fee and pool and tennis privileges upon payment of guest fees.

NON-RESIDENT HOUSE memberships are available to individuals whose principal residence is located more than 50 miles from the Club. Pool and tennis privileges are available upon payment of daily guest fees. Non- Resident House members have no golf privileges.

DEPENDENT CHILDREN of golf members who are living at home or at college are extended the privileges appropriate to their parent's membership classification. Golf privileges are available to such children upon payment of the appropriate golf privilege fee or as a guest when accompanied by the member parent and upon payment of one-half of the greens fee.

DOMESTIC PARTNERS A member in good standing may apply for use and signing privileges for his or her Domestic Partner. Once the application is accepted, the "Domestic Partner" of a member will be entitled to the same signing and use privileges as afforded to a member's spouse. In order to be accepted as a Domestic Partner of a member, a number of criteria must be met to the satisfaction of the Membership Committee and the Board of Governors. Those criteria are available through the General Manager's office. Upon acceptance as a Domestic Partner, the Domestic Partner and his or her immediate family members will have the same privileges at the Club as a spouse member.

Club History

The Manufacturers' Club of Philadelphia, PA, was founded by a group of industrial leaders from the city of Philadelphia. The original Charter dated May 19, 1887, is displayed in the Charter Room adjacent to the Ballroom. The men were predominantly textile manufacturers and, as the Club prospered, a handsome clubhouse was constructed at Broad and Walnut Streets in Philadelphia.

Subsequently, the membership decided it needed a country club. At a meeting of the Board of Directors held February 12, 1923, President John Fisler appointed a committee which secured an option to purchase Ridgewood Farm located in Oreland, Upper Dublin Township. Some of the original plans dated 1910 are on file in the upstairs record room. This 200-acre estate with 27 buildings, including a fine colonial stone dwelling, was the home of William Frazier Harrison. President Fisler signed the agreement of sale on August 3, 1923, for the sum of \$175,000.

A contract was signed with Toomey and Flynn for the construction of the golf course. The A. Raymond Raff Company was engaged to build a locker room, other additions, and alterations to the original residence from plans and specifications prepared by Frank Seeburger, Architect. These plans dated 1923 are also on file in the record room.

The Manufacturers' Country Club was opened to the membership April 1925. The golf course officially opened May 15, 1925, with a 36-hole match between Max H. Marston, former National Amateur Champion, and D. Clark Corkran, holder of the record for lowest qualifying score in the National Amateur Championship, versus Walter Hagan, P.G.A. and British Open Champion, and Joseph H. Kirkwood, Philadelphia Open Champion and former Australian Open Champion.

On May 5, 1933, the Club was reorganized and formed a corporation adopting its present name – *The Manufacturers' Golf and Country Club*.

Few areas in this country have a deeper historical heritage than our Club site and adjacent territory. It was in this exact area that George Washington, as Commander-in-Chief of the Continental Army established the Whitemarsh Encampment in the fall of 1777. Here, General Washington and some 11,000 soldiers were bivouacked from November 2 to December 11. His line of deployment extended from Militia Hill on the West, across Fort Hill, Camp Hill, and along Dreshertown Road east to Edge Hill. General Greene commanded the left wing just north of the Club from Camp Hill Road eastward. On November 2, Washington moved to Whitemarsh and subsequently to those famous winter quarters in Valley Forge.

Club History Continued

Philadelphia, world famous for its beautiful suburbs, knows no spot of greater beauty than the Manufacturers' Golf and Country Club. The Clubhouse, constructed of Chestnut Hill stone, rises on the hill overlooking Sandy Run Creek which meanders through the course adding character to many holes and which feeds the lake in the valley below the Clubhouse. Behind the Clubhouse, a forest of native trees shelters a rock garden at the main entrance. The drive from Dreshertown Road is lined with rhododendrons and hemlocks planted by the Harrison family.

The Clubhouse contains dining rooms, banquet rooms, and private rooms as well as cocktail lounges, grilles, bar, and locker room facilities. The property contains many buildings which include two gate houses, a large barn, garage, halfway house, and several service buildings. The first pool was dedicated in 1939 and has since been replaced with a larger pool, complete with locker rooms. In addition to the original tennis court of the Harrisons, we now have five additional courts. The Club maintains its own wells for its water supply and treats and tests it weekly for purity. There is over a mile of paved roadway through the property and several paved parking areas.

The Clubhouse has been extended and enlarged twice since it was originally built. In 1944, the bar and grille areas were constructed and in 1950 an addition made to the ladies' locker room and golf shop. In 1951, an automatic tram lift was installed from the lower 18th green to the terrace area and was the first of its type ever built.

Your Club is a member of the United States Golf Association, Golf Association of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania Golf Association, Women's Eastern Golf Association, Women's Western Golf Association, and the Pennsylvania State Women's Golf Association. Every spring, our men's and women's golf teams carry the Club colors in weekly matches. Many of our amateur golfers have brought honor to the Club by winning the Philadelphia Amateur, State Amateur, State Junior Amateur, and Women's State Championship.

Mr. Joseph J. (Bud) Lewis was our veteran club professional from 1953 through 1974. Bud won many local and out-of-town tournaments, such as the Philadelphia P.G.A. Open and the Bermuda Open and qualified and played in many U.S. Opens and the National P.G.A.

Mr. Robert (Bob) Hibschan, our previous Head Golf Professional of 30 years, captained the 1969 Penn State Golf Team, was a member of the 1969 NCAA All-American Golf Team, and won a sectional qualification of the 1975 U.S. Open.

Our Head Golf Professional, Mr. Robert (Bob) Fritz, has been employed by Manufacturers' since 1983. He is currently on The Board of Directors of the Philadelphia PGA.

FAQ's

Q: WHAT ARE THE PRIVILEGES OF A GOLF MEMBER?

A: Golf members are entitled to use all of the Club facilities. Golf members do not pay greens fees, but do pay cart and caddie fees. Also, without the payment of additional dues, the spouse of a golf member and their unmarried children under the age of 24 shall be permitted to use all of the facilities of the Club, except golf. Upon the payment of additional dues, the spouse of a golf member may use the golf facilities of the Club at various times on weekdays and after 12:00 p.m. on Saturdays and 11:00 a.m. on Sundays.



Q: CAN I BUY A GOLF MEMBERSHIP FOR MY CORPORATION?

A: No, the Club only offers individual memberships. However, the Club will do everything possible to encourage the use of the facilities by its members' companies. The Club can accommodate business meetings as well as golf outings.



Q: ARE THERE ANY SPECIAL MEMBERSHIP PROGRAMS AVAILABLE FOR THE YOUNG PROFESSIONAL?

A: Yes, within the golf category, a Junior Program is available at the Club for persons between the ages of 24 and 34.



Q: WHAT ARE THE PRIVILEGES OF A HOUSE MEMBERSHIP?

A: House members are entitled to use all of the Club facilities and may play six rounds of golf at any time available to a regular member (not a primary member). A House member may bring up to three guests during each of these rounds with appropriate fees paid. A House member and the House member's spouse may play in all holiday mixed tournaments, provided the House member and spouse have established handicaps. The charge for this play shall be applicable greens fee and the tournament entrance fee. House members may play an unlimited number of rounds after the season ends (November 1st through March 31st) with applicable fees.

Q: ARE THE MEMBERS INVOLVED IN THE CLUB PLANNING?

A: Yes, the Club depends primarily on its membership to continue its development and planning of the Club facilities and golf program. Various committees exist to recommend ways of enhancing the Club's programs. The current committees are:

- Membership Committee
- Golf Committee
- Green Committee
- Marketing & Entertainment Committee
- House Committee
- Finance Committee
- Long-Range Planning Committee
- Recreation Committee



Q: DOES MANUFACTURERS' GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB ALLOW OUTSIDE GROUPS TO USE THE GOLF COURSE DURING THE YEAR?

A: Manufacturers' will permit member-sponsored groups to play golf on Mondays. Member-sponsored groups are given priority by allowing Club members to reserve dates in advance of the preceding year. Groups of up to 50 are also allowed to reserve dates for outings on certain Tuesdays. A deposit to hold the outing date will be required upon booking.



Q: WHAT ARE THE FOOD MINIMUMS?

A: Currently, the Club charges its members a monthly food minimum as follows:

All Classes except Non-Resident \$ 70.00
Non-Resident \$ 0.00



Q: HOW DO I APPLY FOR MEMBERSHIP AT MANUFACTURERS' GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB?

A: An applicant's member sponsor must mail or deliver to the Membership Committee Chairman at the Club a completed and signed application along with letters of recommendation from three current members. Applicants will be required to meet with the Membership Committee for an interview after which time the application is reviewed by the Membership Committee and subsequently the Board of Governors of the Club.

While for many the best of golf comes with a game on a weekend morning, members have access to a variety of leagues, member and guest tournaments, and Suburban League competition. Program offerings for women and juniors are equally attractive, all serving as the foundation of one of the finest country clubs in the Philadelphia area.

Snapshot Of Our Course

From its stunning beginning on the first tee, the golfing experience created by William Flynn is a mosaic unlike any other in the Philadelphia area. With the constant presence of the Sandy Run Creek providing both aesthetic pleasure and golfing risk, the course features a blend of holes unique in nature and design. The opening nine tucks along the western boundary of the 200-acre property, with breathtaking elevation changes highlighting a wide range of shot-making opportunities. The incoming nine, designed along the higher elevation lines of the property, provides a stiff closing test for golfers seeking to bring home a quality score. In all this classic Flynn course, as enjoyable to play as it is challenging to conquer, is the cornerstone of the Manufacturers' experience.

Manufacturers' features 6,707 yards of golf for a par of 71. The course rating is 72 and it has a slope rating of 125. Golf Week has twice selected this course among "America's 100 Best Classical Courses."

The Club is a member of the United States Golf Association, Golf Association of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania Golf Association, Women's Eastern Golf Association, Women's Western Golf Association, and the Pennsylvania State Women's Golf Association.

Golf Course Description

HOLE #1 * PAR 4 * "INVITATION TO GOLF"

Blue 374 * White 370 * Gold 360

You are standing at probably the most beautiful opening hole in the world. It is an invitation that can bite you if your tee shot wanders to the right or left into the yawning bunkers or rough. The tee ball should be placed dead center. Your shot to the green should favor the right side as you'll find that the ball will come leftward if rolling onto the green.

HOLE #2 * PAR 4 * "DOG LEFT"

Blue 396 * White 361 * Gold 349

The only real dog-leg left on the front nine. Your tee shot should carry the right side of the trees lining the fairway along the entire left side. Also, Sandy Run Creek will show itself as well on the left as you prod onward toward the green, only to present itself again as a formidable hazard to be negotiated in your approach to the green. Take enough club.
(P.S. – Some people play it as a five.)

HOLE #3 * PAR 4 * "BIG FOUR"

Blue 445 * White 435 * Gold 390

A great golf hole made for the big hitters. You've really got to rip your drive if you hope to have a chance to reach it in two. Try to keep your ball below and to the right of the hole on your shot into the green. There will be a big left-to-right turn if you roll your ball onto the left side of the green.

HOLE #4 * PAR 3 * "THE DUNES"

Blue 186 * White 158 * Gold 141

Favor the right side of the green with your tee shot (green falls off to the left for tee shot and putt). Most folks are happy with a three here.

HOLE #5 * PAR 4 * "FOX TROT"

Blue 412 * White 378 * Gold 355

The fairway favors a right-to-left tee shot, but don't overdo it! Also, you'll need enough club to carry Sandy Run on your approach to the green. Putts run pretty true.

HOLE #6 * PAR 3 * "HIGH RISE"

Blue 199 * White 190 * Gold 163

Good Par 3. Well bunkered. Will take full carry tee shot as a rule, but be careful! There's trouble in the back too! Putting back-to-front can be exciting.

HOLE #7 * PAR 5 * "MOORE'S GLEE"

Blue 506 * White 500 * Gold 463

A relative reprieve up to this point in your round. However, don't be lulled into complacency because there's trouble on the right and on the left that can cost you an extra shot or two. As you get closer to the green, it can get awfully sandy. Oh yeah! The green falls from right-to-left.

HOLE #8 * PAR 3 * "WEE THREE"

Blue 117 * White 105 * Gold 93

Looks easy, huh? Be sure to check the wind before you swing.

HOLE #9 * PAR 5 * "AZALEA BLAZE"

Blue 467 * White 461 * Gold 435

The strait shot marker is rewarded the entire length of the hole. The green is two-tiered. You must stay below the hole!!

HOLE #10 * PAR 4 * "TOUGHIE"

Blue 425 * White 415 * Gold 407

A slight dog leg right appears after placing your tee shot to the left of all the trouble on the right. You'll need about another 180 yards of carry, which again is protected by Sandy Run, from the crest to the center of the green. Putting clue: The ball will roll well from front to back; it will roll very well from back to front.

HOLE #11 * PAR 3 * "THE SHEEP HOUSE"

Blue 201 * White 185 * Gold 175

If you're lucky, you can run one up between the left side bunker and the huge one on the right; otherwise, you have to carry the green. The ball will come right to left going up, and will roll real well coming back down.

HOLE #12 * PAR 5 * "BUD LEWIS"

Blue 512 * White 500 * Gold 475

Named for our prestigious Pro Emeritus. It's a slight dog right and well bunkered. Favor a left center off the tee. The hole will play longer because of grass swail about 20 to 40 yards fronting the green.

HOLE #13 * PAR 3 "THE REDWOOD"

Blue 233 * White 222 * Gold 175

Another real good Par 3 hole which requires both distance and accuracy off the tee. The green is long from front to back, but there's a "valley of sin" on the left as you approach the green. On the green, the ball will come from right to left.

HOLE #14 * PAR 4 * "SIGNATURE"

Blue 418 * White 387 * Gold 340

A great hole that's fun to play conceptually and physically. You must be straight or right-center off the tee to avoid trouble on the left and the huge bunker on the right. The fairway will fall left to right through the green, so play your ball accordingly. Your putt will go left to right. (P.S. – The green is also well bunkered.)

HOLE #15 * PAR 5 * "THE ELYSIAN FIELD"

Blue 551 * White 538 * Gold 465

Beechwood trees and sand bunkers guard the right side. The fairway falls gently to the left, so aim your tee ball to the right of center. Your second shot should be one more of control than distance as there's a tendency to catch rough or trees on the fairway, as the fairway narrows somewhat around 400 yards out. Bunkers right and left protect the green. Try to stay below the hole with your shot into the green.

HOLE #16 * PAR 4 * "THE QUARRY"

Blue 415 * White 404 * Gold 390

Always a challenge! Requires a long straight tee shot that must stay left center to avoid bunkers and rough on the right. If you're too far right, your shot to the green will have to be long and true in order to carry the quarry which fronts the green on the right. The green is also bunkered right and left. A real good Par 4!

HOLE #17 * PAR 4 "SYCAMORES"

Blue 384 * White 343 * Gold 340

Looks very easy after all you've been through, but watch out! You'll need a tee shot right of center (or the large willow trees on the left will block you out). You must keep your ball below the hole on your shot into the green. Oh yes, there are bunkers right and left and Sandy Run in front.

HOLE #18 * PAR 4 * "HARRISON'S HILL"

Blue 397 * White 390 * Gold 355

You'll enjoy this fishing hole – it's another good test, especially when the match is all even after 17 holes. Your tee shot should be center to right in the fairway. From there, you will need a good second shot into a two-tiered green which is well bunkered left and right. Uphill putts swing right to left. Downhill putts roll and roll and roll

AFTER YOU HAVE CONQUERED #18

Take what you need for your drive off the 1st tee. Ride the tram to the tee, and our volunteers will have your cart waiting at the bottom of the hill.

When you have completed your round, please bring your cart to the parking lot via the roadway which runs past the "barn" (between #9 and 10 fairways) and record your score on the computer in the Grille Room.
